In addition to this benefit, the atmosphere of winter camp is much more relaxed. I hope that every teen is able to participate in this spiritually enriching time at Palomar Christian Camp.

COST

- Cost is \$190 per camper
- Those on Scholarship for the year earned a cost of \$95 (50% off).
- A \$40 deposit that will be included in the final cost is due by the end of October.

LODGING

The cabins are dorm style with bunk beds. Each cabin has four rooms, a communal space, and two large bathrooms with sinks, showers, and toilets in each. Cabins will be divided by gender.

EXPECTED WEATHER

During the winter season, the average temperature on Palomar mountain ranges between low 50s and low 30s. There is a small chance of snow due to the elevation.

DEPARTURE AND ARRIVAL

THURSDAY

Meet at the church at 1:00 pm. Please arrive on-time in order for us to leave promptly. The camp is only 1-hour and a half away so the drive won't take long. However, the drive up the mountain is very curvy. Please consider giving your teen Dramamine before you arrive if your teen is easily car-sick.

SATURDAY

We will plan to return to the church around 1:00 pm once we have finished our last session.

SUNDAY

Please try not to miss church the day after camp. Get a good night's rest on Saturday and plan on being in church for both morning and evening service.

PACKING

Please bring a sleeping bag, pillow, towels, toiletries, Bible, note pad, and a pen or pencil. You may also want to bring sunglasses, a flashlight, lip balm, a beanie, and a camera.

Please do not bring pets, cigarettes, drugs, alcoholic beverages, matches, fireworks, weapons of any kind, electronic devices (e.g., no cell phones, smart watches, game devices, headphones etc. You may bring your phone on the bus to contact your parents on the way home. Use of phones will be prohibited during the trip.), clothing promoting worldly activities, large amounts of money, or

valuables.

Luggage. You may bring one carry-on size suitcase and one personal bag (like a backpack), as well as your sleeping bag and pillow. Remember, this is only a 2-night trip so you don't need to bring your whole closet.

DRESS CODE

Weather: During the winter season, the average temperature on Palomar mountain ranges between low 50s and low 30s. You will want to bring a warm jacket/coat. There is a low chance of snow due to the elevation but the evenings will get cold.

Ladies. Any fashion worn must come at least to the top of the knee.

Knee-length skirts or dresses are appropriate for evening services. Loose fitting jeans and pants are appropriate for activity times. Tight shirts, clothing with low necklines in front or back, or styles leaving the midriff bare may not be worn. Leggings are not permitted outside of the dorms unless worn underneath a skirt for warmth.

Men. Jeans/pants, collared shirts, and closed-toe shoes are appropriate for evening services. No exposed undergarments.
